SECURITY AT SHOWS

In light of recent events The Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all Societies of the importance of security at dog shows.

The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert. Should anyone see anything suspicious or of concern speak immediately to an official at the show.

These "Special Awards" are judged as an entirely separate entry from the main show proper.

IF YOUR DOG IS BEATEN IN A SPECIAL AWARD COMPETITION IT IS NOT CLASSED AS A BEATEN DOG AND IS NOT DISQUALIFIED FROM CHALLENGING IN THE MAIN SHOW.

The "Special Awards" are entirely arranged as a method of promoting novice judges.

Special Award Judge - Mrs Shirley Hockenhull (Ultrastar)

I started with dog showing in 1984 and before that tried my hand in obedience and agility with a GSD. I started showing dogs after my first encounter with an Akita, these became my passion. In 2001 I took an interest in the Russian Black Terriers. We took ownership of our first one in 2002. We still have these as part of our lives today. I give C.C's in Akitas and am also on the A3 list with the RBT plus a few other breeds. I became interested in the Spanish Water Dog via a family member who was living out in Spain at the time, so started to look into them in the U.K. I liked what I saw. The more I looked the more I liked. I have followed the breed for a few years now even stewarding for the breed at championship shows which to me was good way of watching and learning. I also steward at Crufts and many other championship shows around the UK.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday 2nd April 2022.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.

- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards it's colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight and height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. **PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

- YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- **GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- **POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under The Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL WORKING GUNDOG A dog is eligible for entry in Special Working Gundog classes for its breed if it has a working Gundog Certificate, a Kennel Club Show Gundog Working Certificate or won an award, Diploma of Merit or Certificate of Merit in competition at a Field Trial held under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club.

- **GOOD CITIZEN DOG SCHEME:** For dogs which have achieved their Good Citizen Dog Scheme Bronze Award Certificate or above. Certificates should be available at the show for inspection if requested.
- **SPECIAL AWARD JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- SPECIAL AWARD POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- SPECIAL AWARD OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
- **NOT FOR COMPETITION:** Only puppies of six calendar months of age on the day of the show are eligible for exhibition, however puppies of four months and over are accepted NFC but must be KC Registered and included on the entry form.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 7.00 am.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging follows breed judging at The National Dog Show.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry fees: Members £16.00 first entry per dog. Subsequent entries with same dog £3.00. Non-Members £20.00 first entry per dog. Subsequent entries with same dog £3.00. Special Award Classes £2.00 per class per dog. Not for Competition £5.00. Entries may be made online at www.highampress.co.uk.
- 6. Prize money: There is no prize money on offer at this show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show (if scheduled). Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- 11. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move</u>. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered. Regulation F.1.c Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their

discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at all Kennel Club licensed Shows. Furthermore, dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Match Competitions.

19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which

will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

- 20. The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition through vice or disease and if such exclusion takes place the entrance fee will be forfeited.
- 21. Should any Judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the Committee reserve to themselves the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be returned.
- 22. An exercise area will be provided. Exhibitors, handlers and those in charge of dog(s) are reminded of their responsibility to clean up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge.
- 23. All monies due to the Society which remain unpaid, either entry fees or bank charges accrued through dishonored cheques will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 24. Parents and those in charge of children are reminded of their responsibility for the care and safety of children at this show. The Officers and Committee of this Society will accept no responsibility for damage caused by, or injury to children at this show.
- 25. Exhibitors Please Note: In accordance with Kennel Club guidelines, exhibitors must display exhibit number/ owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

- · Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the doa.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- · Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
